

Message from the **President**

Dr. A.Q. Khan NI & Bar HI Founder and President



It is a matter of immense satisfaction that during the year 2016-17 Society for the Advancement of Community, Health, Education and Training-Pakistan made successful strides, in expanding its service to the rural communities.

To recount, in the thematic area of health, the medical clinics of the Society, treated 36,735 cases of communicable and non-communicable diseases, resulting in 21,546 patients receiving free medical treatment. Patients treated a year earlier i.e. during 2015-16 were 20,722.

Under education program, 104 persons (82% male & 38% female) received basic and advanced computing skills, enabling them for job as well as preparing them for further studies.

To enhance income generating capacity of rural women, 299 girls were given 6-months training in designing, cutting, stitching and embroidery. In addition, 64 women entrepreneurs were trained in beautician skills and in operating beauty salons on commercial basis.

To impart lifesaving life enhancing training, awareness and skills to the under privileged, Society has been holding its popular "Behnan de Mehfil" and "Bhrawan Di Mehfil" sessions since inception. Community members keenly join these informative seminars and during the year, 1,890 persons participated.

Society also implemented two important pro-women projects in collaboration with Aurat Foundation, USAID, and Punjab Skills Development Fund (PSDF). Society encouraged young lawyers of District Bar Association of Rawalpindi in taking up pro-women cases by extending training, setting up facilitation kiosks, documentation and research of cases relevant to pro-women laws. Under a project, sponsored by the Punjab Skills Development Fund (PSDF), Society trained 336 girls in four trades of textile production and marketing. This enabled them to earn their livelihood in addition to their family income.

As the following pages of the 19th Annual Report show, Society increased its financial resources by generating its own income without reliance on cash donations. Society believes in self-reliance in carrying out all its programs.

The task of empowering communities in a social order with about thirty percent of poverty and fifty eight percent of literacy in Pakistan is enormous and requires sustained efforts by all and sundry to ameliorate the conditions of the disadvantaged. In the field of nutrition alone, about 44% of Pakistani children are estimated by the UNICEF to be suffering from malnutrition. This effects adversely the development efforts of the state, due to poor health of mothers and children. SACHET remains eager to collaborate with domestic and international organizations, like UNICEF, WHO, Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition, the US Centers for Disease Control, Nutrition International and others for including Nutrition Programs in its future efforts.

Society acknowledges with gratitude, cooperation extended by the communities served and by the Aurat Foundation, USAID, Punjab Skills Development Fund, pharmaceutical companies like Hilton Pharma & Wilson Pharmaceuticals, philanthropists like Daikin and Afzal Corporation. Society looks forward to their cooperation in future as well.

The guidance received from the members of the Board of Directors in highly appreciated. Management of the Society admirably shouldered their responsibilities within the available resources.

Introduction

SACHET-Pakistan (Society for the Advancement of Community, Health, Education and Training) is a multi-dimensional, forward looking, gender sensitive and environmental friendly welfare cum development oriented organization. As a grass root community development, non-profit organization, SACHET-Pakistan is making its contribution to the disadvantaged communities since 1999. The organization's name reveals its four key program areas i.e. health, education, livelihood, and training.

SACHET's programs are both need and right-based; with provision of free primary health care, education with emphasis on female education, trainings, skills development, poverty alleviation cum income generation, child protection, prevention of violence against women and harassment. Removal of discrimination in society on the basis of gender, class, ethnicity, religion, cultural diversity is at the heart of our programs.

Geographical Coverage

Since inception, SACHET is recognized as a leading community development organization in Pakistan and has served the communities in all four provinces including Gilgit Baltistan and Azad Jammu Kashmir through several innovative and community driven projects. The permanent areas of intervention of SACHET's programs include districts of Islamabad, Pawalaindi and Attack through its Community Development Contervention of Sacri

Rawalpindi and Attock through its Community Development Centers located at Banigala, Gagri, Pinyali and Pathargarh.

Thematic areas

- 1. Free delivery of primary health services and care to the poor and indigents on sustainable basis, in particular to the mother and children.
- 2. Reproductive health services and dissemination of awareness for the protection of rights of the stakeholders in this field.
- 3. Violence against women, girls and children, within the broader domain of reproductive health programming.
- 4. Skills development with focus on income generating programs for both male and female members of the community at the grass roots.
- 5. Formal education (primary and secondary) through strengthening public sector educational institutions.

Beneficiaries

- 1. Children, adolescents and youth, women and men indigents particularly for health, education and skills development training programs with in programs within the communities served.
- 2. Female victims and survivors of violence for health, education and socio-economic empowerment programs.
- 3. Women, girls, men and boys for interventions aimed at ending gender based violence, including dowry violence and other gender issues.
- 4. Disaster hit, underserved and underprivileged communities of rural Pakistan.
- 5. Community elders, local government administrators, artisans, teachers, religious leaders, lawyers, media practitioners.





Many times one patient is diagnosed with two or more diseases, so he or she is provided free medication essentially required for all diseases keeping in view the rational use of medicine. In other words, the total number of patients visiting SCDPs may differ from total number of diseases treated. Medicine consumption reports are prepared according to the number of diseases treated in all SCDPs every month. Normally one patient who visits SCDP gets medicine for 3 days with the exception of Antibiotics which are given for a complete duration of therapy. Also all SCDPs are equipped to provide basic emergency care to the ones who need basic emergency services.





Awareness and Advocacy Program Highlights 2016~17

SACHET has been holding gender specific advocacy gatherings known as 'Behnan di Mehfil, Bhrawan di Mehfil' in local communities of Islamabad, Rawalpindi and Attock District. Mehfils are regularly held as an appropriate mechanisms for initial sensitization, followed by active involvement and voluntary participation by women, men, girls and boys to develop healthy habits. Topic covered in these Mehfils include family planning, health and hygiene, precautionary measures to avoid diseases like HIV & AIDS, Hepatitis, Diabetes, Seasonal Diseases for adults and children and awareness regarding gender based violence.

Independence Day Celebrations

To mark the occasion of Independence Day of Pakistan, SACHET organized a full day funfair for women, girls and children at SCDP (SACHET Community Development Program) Gagri located on Japan Road Sihala district Islamabad on 16th August 2016. The main objective for organizing the event was to celebrate Independence Day of Pakistan by engaging local community members especially women, girls and children of Gagri and surrounding villages.

More than 150 community members including women and children, teachers and principals of local schools, religious leaders, representatives of the local council of Gagri and adjacent villages participated in the event.





Defense Day Celebrations

A day long fun fair was held at SCDP Pinyali, located at Main Kahuta Road, District Rawalpindi on 8th September, 2016 jointly organized by SACHET head office and SCDP Pinyali team for the women, girls and children. The event was organized to commemorate Defense Day of Pakistan by engaging local community members of Pinyali and surrounding villages. Furthermore the event aimed to create local support from communities for the long term sustainability of services at SCDP Pinyali.

Around 200 community members including women and children, teachers and principals of local schools, religious leaders, representatives of the local council of Pinyali and adjacent villages participated in the event.



Cooperation & Partnerships 2016-17

Strengthening of District Bar Association

In November 2016, SACHET, was awarded a partnership grant under cycle-11 of the Gender Equity Program (GEP) of USAID managed by Aurat Foundation, to implement a project on "Strengthening of district bar association and setting up facilitation kiosk in courts" at district court Rawalpindi. The project aimed to improve women's access to justice; expand economic opportunities for women; advocate for women's social



and political empowerment; support survivors of gender-based violence; and build the capacity of government and civil society to prevent, respond to, and eliminate gender-based violence.

The objectives of the project were:

- 1. Enhancing gender equity by expanding women's access to justice and women's human rights across Pakistan.
- 2. To improve women's access to justice by capacitating and strengthening the role of District Bar Associations in GEP select districts.
- 3. It is envisioned to accomplish protecting women's legal rights.
- 4. Encouraging pro-bono services to women litigants.
- 5. Facilitation of information dissemination hubs for women seeking legal assistance.







Project was officially launched on 9th February, 2017 at Flash men's Hotel Rawalpindi, by inviting relevant district level stake holders from public and private sector, legal fraternity, media etc. It was attended by almost 200 participants. The President District Bar Association Rawalpindi, Mr. Sajjad Akbar Abbasi and Secretary General SACHET- Pakistan, Mr. Muhammad Faheem signed the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for the smooth execution and implementation of the project in district court Rawalpindi.

Some major milestones were achieved during the brief project period such as completion of need assessment exercise to upgrade district bar association's office, formation of district women support group, setting up of facilitation kiosks at district court Rawalpindi, training of 45 lawyers on gender friendly legal practices, documentation and monitoring of case studies on Muslim family laws, child custody laws and pro women laws. The IEC material-Booklet on Pro women Laws (both English & Urdu), Posters, Banners, Standees and other publications were designed and developed over the period of time.

Women Focused Training under Punjab Skills Development Fund (PSDF)

In December 2016, SACHET-Pakistan was selected as an implementing partner of Punjab Skills Development Fund to impart skills training for girls in Rawalpindi District. PSDF is a not-for-profit company set up under the Companies Ordinance 1984 by the Government of the Punjab in collaboration with Department for International Development UK. SACHET launched a 6 months skill oriented training program for the girls of Rawalpindi district in trades of Textile Sales and Marketing, Fabric Quality Inspector, Domestic



Tailoring, Fabric Cutting Expert. The trainings were organized at three approved training facilities of SACHET located in SCDP Gagri, SCDP, Pinyali and SACHET Training Center Islamabad with collaboration of Punjab Skilled Development Fund.

The project successfully achieved its mandated objective to facilitate and ensure TEVTA (Technical Education and Vocational Training Authority) approved skills development training for the unemployed women and girls and empowering them to earn livelihood for themselves.




























