Message from the President

Strong Initiatives Healthy Growth

During the year, SACHET Pakistan has contributed positively and augmented the public sector efforts of health service delivery, extending educational and skill development opportunities and carrying out advocacy and awareness programs.



During the year ending on 30th June 2012, the social order in Pakistan remained plagued with accelerated extremism and terrorist acts, rampant corruption, poor governance, unemployment, inflation and above all power and energy shortage. All these factors contributed to an anemic growth rate of the economy which in turn has contributed to the increasing level of socio-economic problems for the individuals and communities throughout Pakistan. These dynamics have made our task more challenging.

Some note worthy initiatives of public sector like awareness Programs for women rights, distribution of laptops to deserving students, setting up of Danish Schools, Benazir Income Support Program, Benazir Waseela-e-Sehet Program, micro credit schemes have contributed to the amelioration of the lot of the disadvantaged communities, to some extent. SACHET is privileged to be a partner in implementing some of that program with the public sector. During the year 2012, SACHET Pakistan contributed positively and augmented the public sector efforts of health service delivery, extending educational and skill development opportunities and carrying out advocacy and awareness programs. I note with satisfaction that over 38,000 indigent men, women and children were provided free primary medical care through its well maintained community based clinics. At the same time educational scholarships were provided to 61 deserving students, 4175 visits made by youth at SACHET Youth Friendly Centers, 236 girls and women received skill development trainings. 332 number of boys and girls successfully completed computer literacy courses. These efforts are all dedicated investment in the future of Pakistan. During the past thirteen (13) years, women and men benefitting from the programs of SACHET are positively contributing to the nation as responsible citizens.

It is heartening to note that due to committed efforts of its management and competent team of social practitioners, SACHET Pakistan, the year 2012 saw thankfully an expanded partnerships with other donor agencies, like BISP, USAID, Aurat Foundation, Asia Foundation, GIZ, Plan International and UNFPA. I am sanguine that not only cooperation of SACHET with all these implementing partners will continue but will grow at enhanced levels. Way forward at the end of this Annual Report describes some of the areas of future bilateral and multilateral cooperation.

SACHET Pakistan and its technical arm AGEHI Resource Centre looks forward to this cooperation.

Background

SACHET (Society for the Advancement of Community, Health, Education and Training) is a registered, non-profit, voluntary social welfare and development organization.

SACHET has been working in social sector since 1999 with the aim of assisting disadvantaged communities in gaining their human rights, enabling them to live with dignity and respect.

SACHET works holistically to provide necessary support and facilitation in four key program areas: health, education, livelihood and trainings by provision of essential services, Advocacy, communication, information dissemination, research and training of youth and adolescents (ages 9 to 19 years), building up community partnerships are some of the strategies followed, for social and economic empowerment.

Core program activities at SACHET Pakistan are assisted through its own endowment fund, donations from local and overseas Pakistani philanthropists. Though not financially dependent, SACHET is open to partnerships and cooperation with local and international partners including UN agencies, global development agencies and multilateral development institutes.

Ethical Values Practiced By SACHET

SACHET follows gender sensitive organizational policies and values in its human resource, administration, finance and program management. Since all programs are based on a combination of both need and right-based perspectives, SACHET has ensured the placement of child protection policies at work places; prevention of women's abuse and harassment; and discrimination against employees on the basis of gender, class, ethnicity, religion and cultural diversity as an integral part of job contracts. All employees are hired on merit and after hiring they undergo a periodic transparent performance appraisal. It has also updated its program planning, monitoring & evaluation policy, human resource policy and financial policies to best match the organizational needs and to conform to the national and international accountability practices.

- Children, adolescents and youth, indigents particularly for health, education and training programs within the communities served
- Female victims and survivors of violence for health, education and socio-economic empowerment programs

- Women, girls, men and boys for interventions aimed at ending gender based violence, including dowry violence and other gender issues

- Community elders, local government administrators, artisans, teachers, religious leaders etc.

Geographical Coverage

The coverage of SACHET's areas of intervention include districts of Islamabad, Rawalpindi, Attock, Chakwal, Mandi Bahauddin, Jhelum, Gujrat, Khushab, Sargodha, Bhakar, Mianwali and Faisalabad. The outreach of advocacy and awareness programs is country wide.



Thematic Areas of Intervention

Health

Health is the largest program of SACHET among all other services and 70% of the resources are allocated for the services rendered in health sector.

Provision of primary health care services, maternal and child health, including preventive care, family planning services, referrals for secondary and tertiary care facilities, awareness on HIV and AIDS and its prevention; hepatitis and its prevention, communicable diseases and prevention, health sessions and counseling in ante-natal period including nutrition.

Education

To ensure the provision of quality education at all SCDP (SACHET Community Development Program) areas to both girls and boys and to help improve the quality of education as well as the economic conditions of these communities is what SACHET's Education Program stands for.

Initiatives include Primary and secondary formal education through school rehabilitation program, computer literacy, documentation center, scholarships for deserving students especially girls in the target areas.

Training

The training program focuses on the most relevant and most important contemporary development issues. It is specially designed to meet the fundamentals of essential demand of knowledge and skills required by communities at grass root level and for the development professionals.

Livelihood

Income generating skill development program focuses on variety of need based innovative projects including technical and vocational trainings, shop-for-a-cause, a concept shop projecting subsidized sales outlet for under privileged skilled workers and through SACHET Art Gallery - a forum for the exhibition of emerging arts and artisans work.

Youth

Pakistan youth, including children are the primary focus for all social investment initiatives for development by SACHET.

Gender

Non-discriminating gender participation and empowerment is a cross cutting theme for all SACHET's programs/activities.

Implementation Strategies

SACHET is following a successful three-pronged strategy for implementation of its programs

- 1 Direct service delivery, i.e. community based tangible services including free primary health care services, provision of scholarships for academic studies and arrangement of trainings on income generation and life skills.
- 2 Result oriented advocacy on community issues like sexual and reproductive health rights, school rehabilitation, gender equity, protection of women against gender based violence and girl's empowerment of the disadvantaged sections of the society.
- 3 Establishing and strengthening systems and networks between and amongst young females and other segments of the community in order to supplement community welfare and develop linkages between community based organizations, governmental and private institutions including United Nation agencies.

Approaches adopted by SACHET for the implementation of policies include research, training and organization of influential groups within the community to undertake capacity building opportunities. Our strategies include disseminating awareness and mainstreaming the disadvantaged; gender sensitization, participation, equity and empowerment; and fighting against, economic and social issues like increase in population, control of communicable and non-communicable diseases including HIV-AIDS, mother and child health, poor personal, family and community hygiene.

Progress Highlights 2012

The progress report covers the period starting from 1st July 2011 till 30 June 2012

- 1** As per HMIS (health management Information System), a total number of 38,033 patients have been provided free medical care for both communicable and non-communicable diseases at SACHET free clinics located in Banigala, Gagri, Pinyali and Pathar Garh. Highest patient turn over was observed at SACHET Free clinic in Gagri where a total number of 10,748 patients were provided free medical services.
- 2** SACHET received an amount of Rs. 1,000,000/- (Rupees one million) grant from Zakat and Usher department, Government of Pakistan for the provision of medicines at free clinics.
- 3** During the year sufficient quantity of medicines were received as a donation from Hilton Pharmaceutical in generous response to the request made by the President. The monetary worth of the said medicine was estimated around Rs. 300,000/-
- 4** Under community awareness activities, a total number of 90 Mehfil (Behnan Di Mehfil, Bharawan Di Mehfil) and 329 individual sessions were organized at all SCDP (SACHET Community Development Program) units on regular basis. In these sessions a total number of 2232 community members participated.
- 5** Under computer training project, 332 students (261 boys and 71 girls) were provided trainings on basic computing, advance computing and hardware expertise.
- 6** Under vocational training project a number of 236 female community members were provided trainings on cutting, sewing, stitching, embroidery and preparation of decoration items. The centers are located at SCDP Pinyali, Gagri and Pathar Garh.
- 7** Under Scholarship project, a total number of 61 deserving students (26 Male and 35 Female) from local communities of Banigala, Gagri, Pinyali and Pathar Garh were provided financial assistance of Rs. 69,530/- for the educational expenses during the year.
- 8** At YFC (Youth friendly centre) Banigala, a number of 4715 visits made by the local youth to get recreational services including library, cricket, badminton, volley ball and carom board.
- 9** In 2011-12 RHIA (Reproductive Health Initiative with Adolescents) program with support of Plan International, was up-scaled to 06 wards in Bari Imam, Islamabad with focus on increased participation of communities and technical capacity building of adolescents, Health and Environment Committee(HEC), Community Health Promoter (CHPs) and Community Health Educators (CHEs), identification of roles and responsibilities and facilitation of change catalysts in undertaking community mobilization and child centered community development.
- 10** SACHET Pakistan implemented a project "Addressing Gender Based Violence & promoting Women Rights" under Gender Equity Program (GEP) of Aurat Foundation (AF), by the support of the American People through United States Agency for International Development (USAID) in 10 districts of Punjab (Rawalpindi, Chakwal, Attock, Jhelum, Sargodha Gujrat, Mandi Bhauddin, Khushab, Mianwali and Bhakar).
- 11** SACHET Pakistan successfully implemented the pilot project, Waseela-e-Sehet Program of Benazir Income Support Program, Government of Pakistan with the assistance of GIZ in Faisalabad District. Under Benazir Sehat Card campaign, SACHET reached to 39,845 beneficiaries (women) and distributed 33,643 Sehat cards to the selected beneficiaries in 6 tehsils of Faisalabad District in a record time of six weeks followed by an extensive two weeks media campaign using radio and local cable TV.

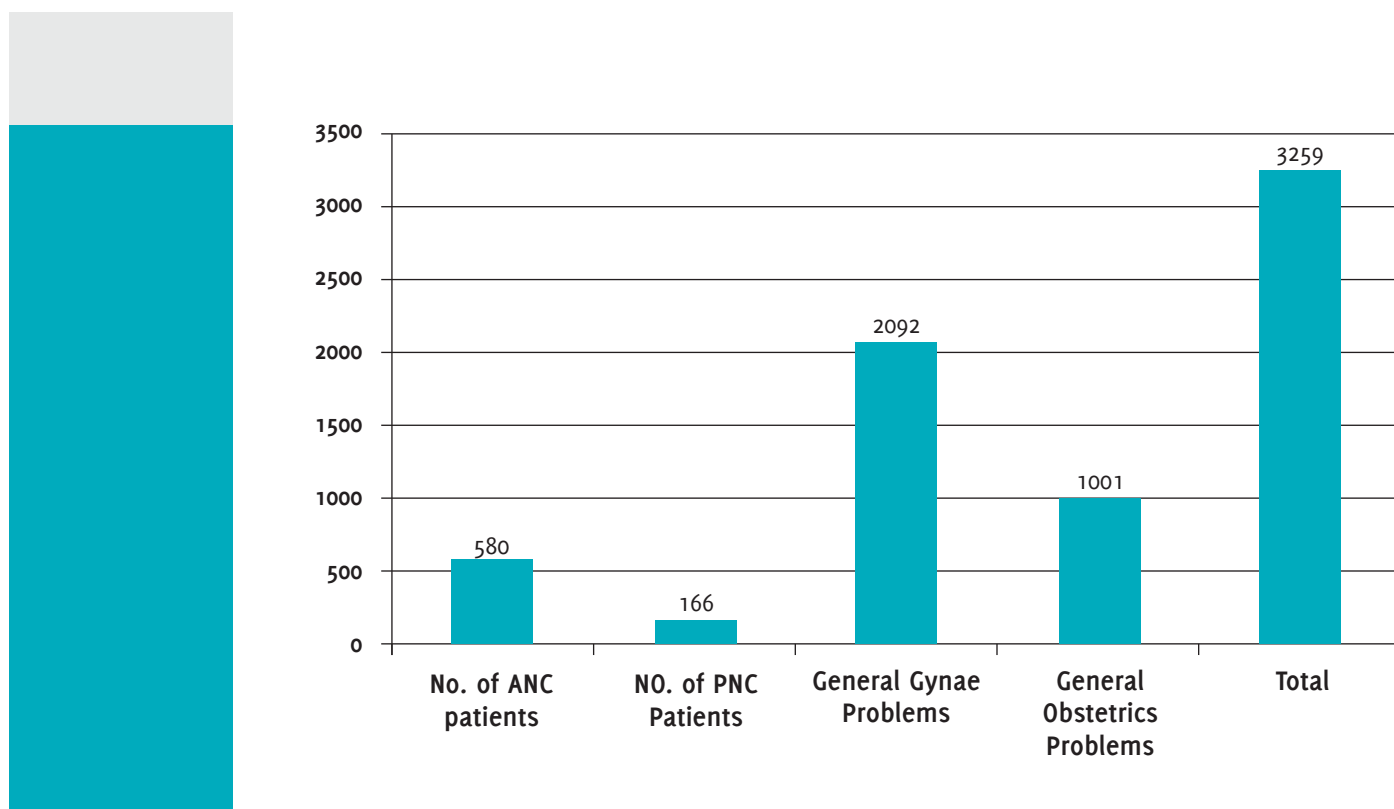

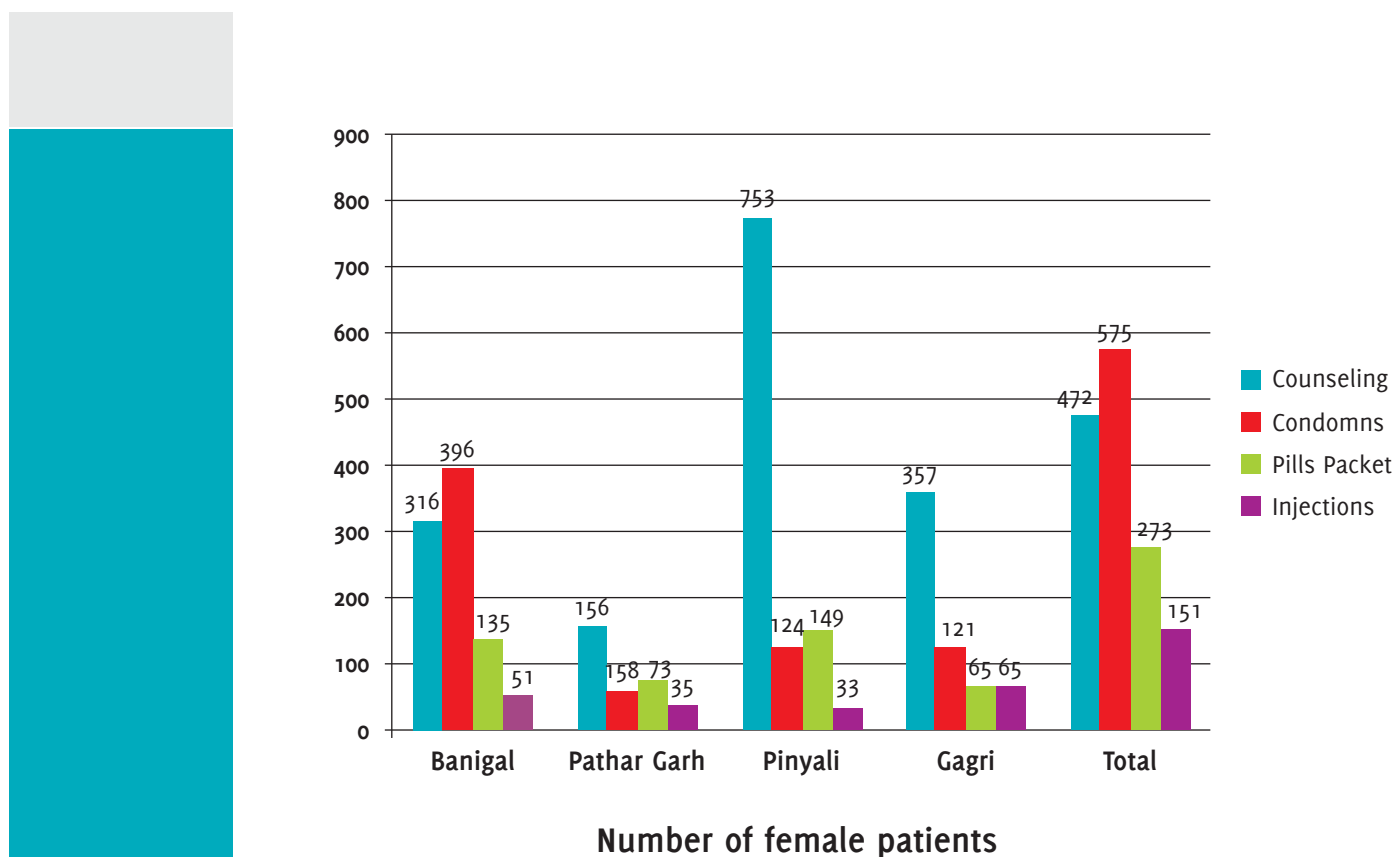

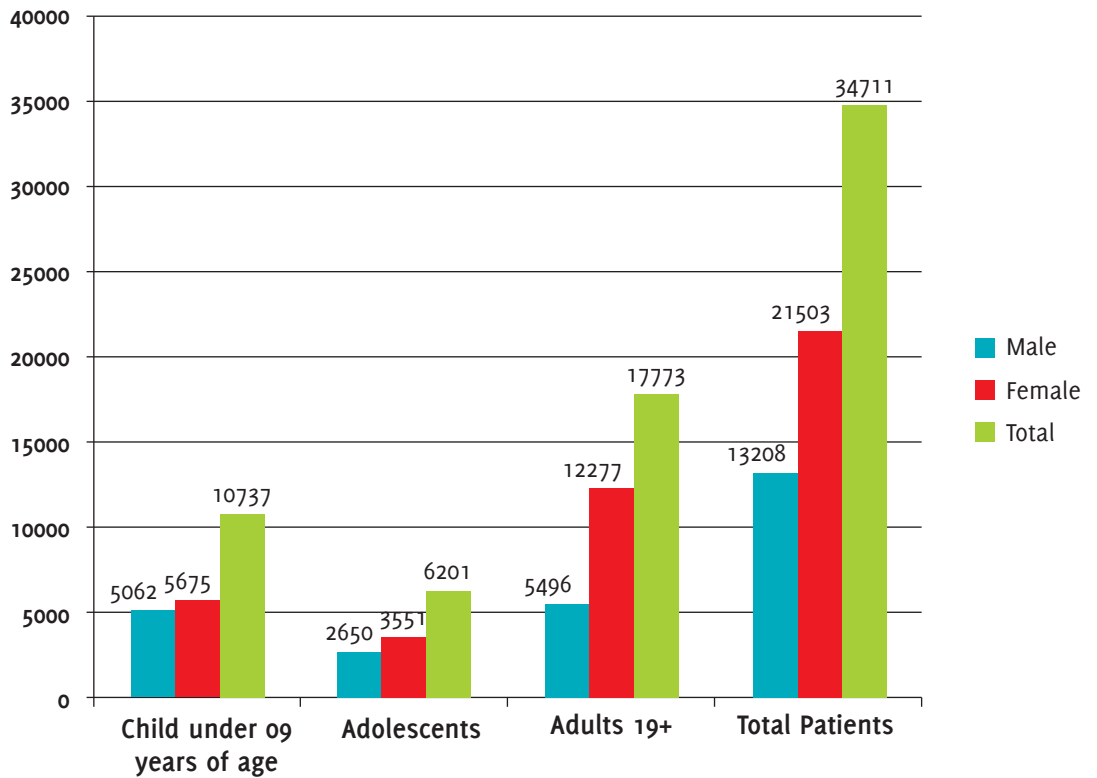
MNCH Cases Reported at SACHET Clinics



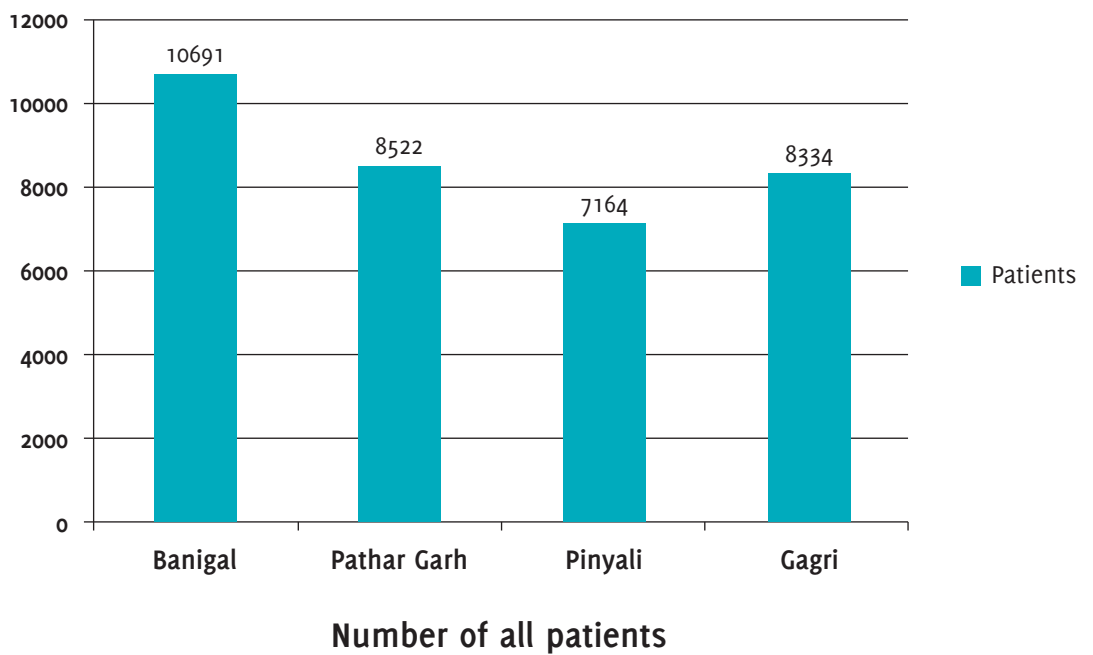
Family Planning Services at SACHET Clinics



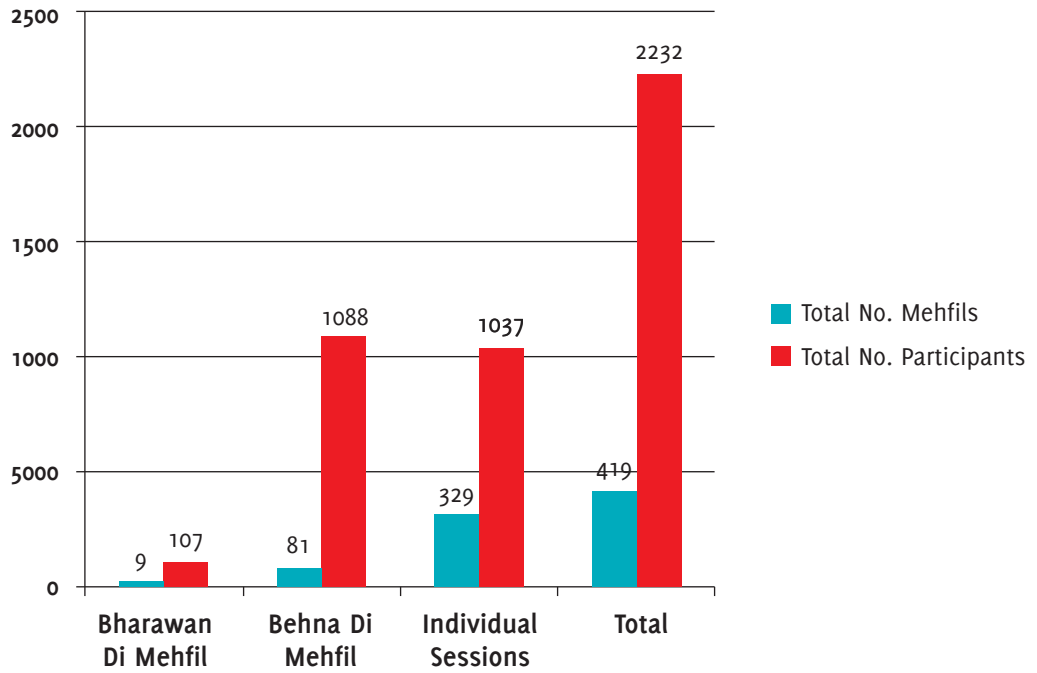
Age Wise OPC Consultations at all 04 SCDP Clinics (2012)



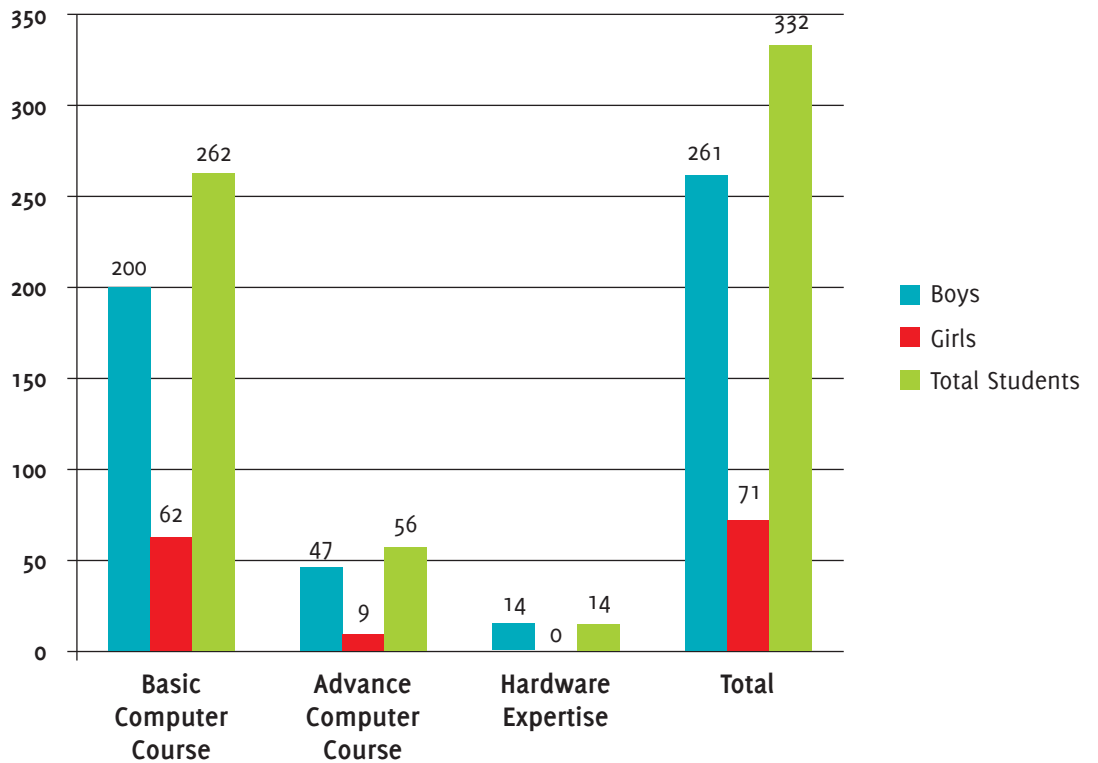
Locality Wise Patients Turnover (2011-12)

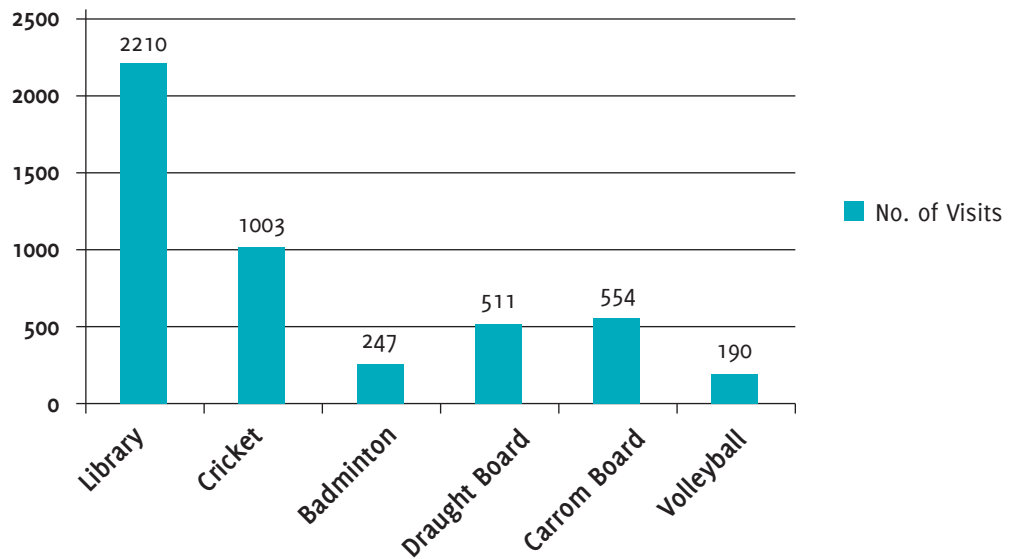


Computer Literacy Courses (2011-12)

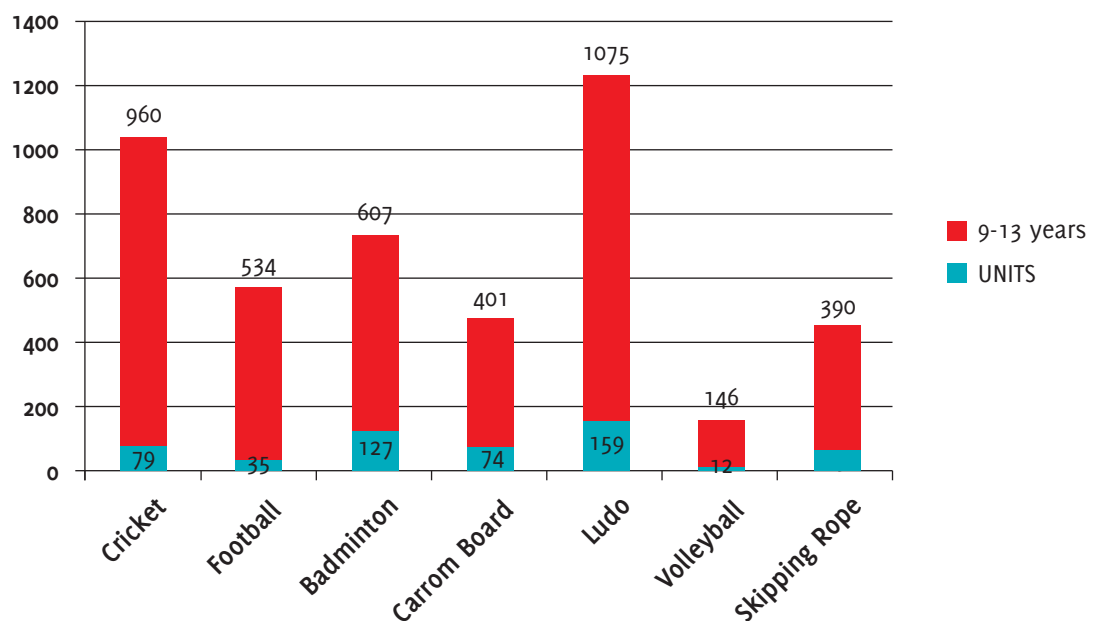
No. of Visits by youth at YFC (2011-12)



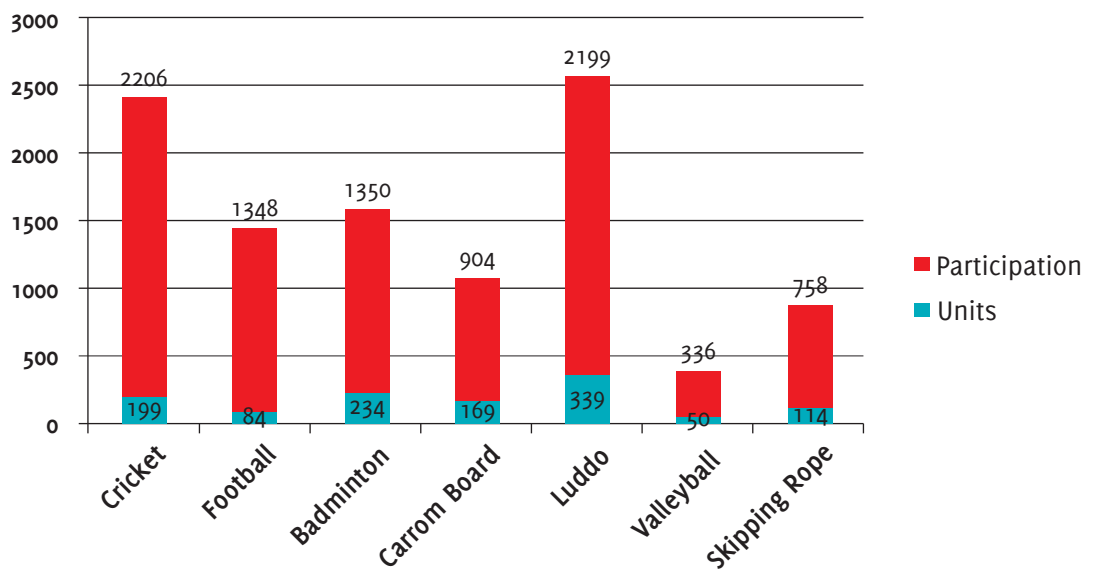
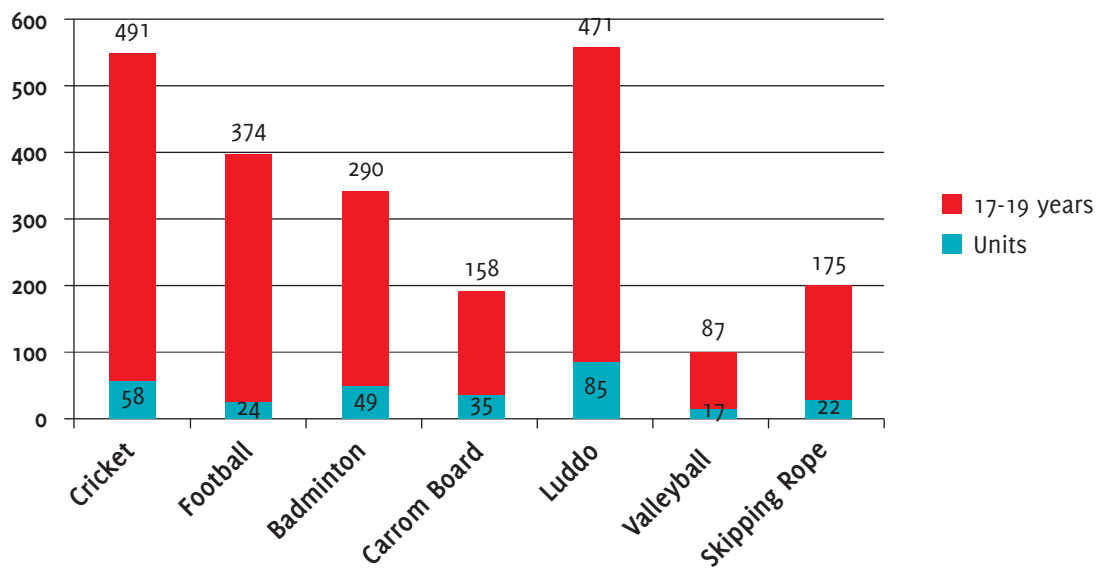
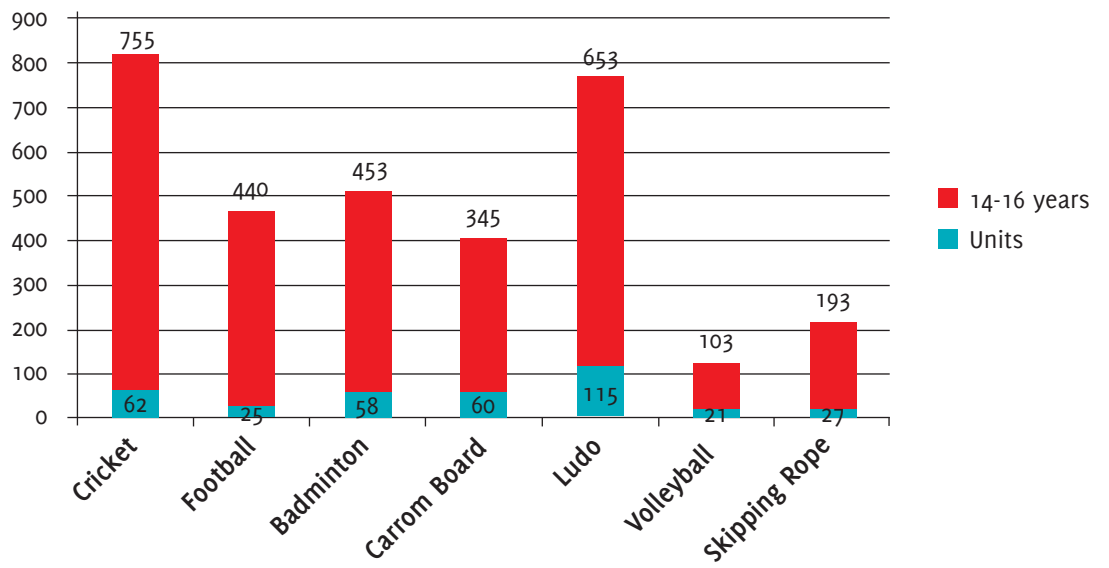

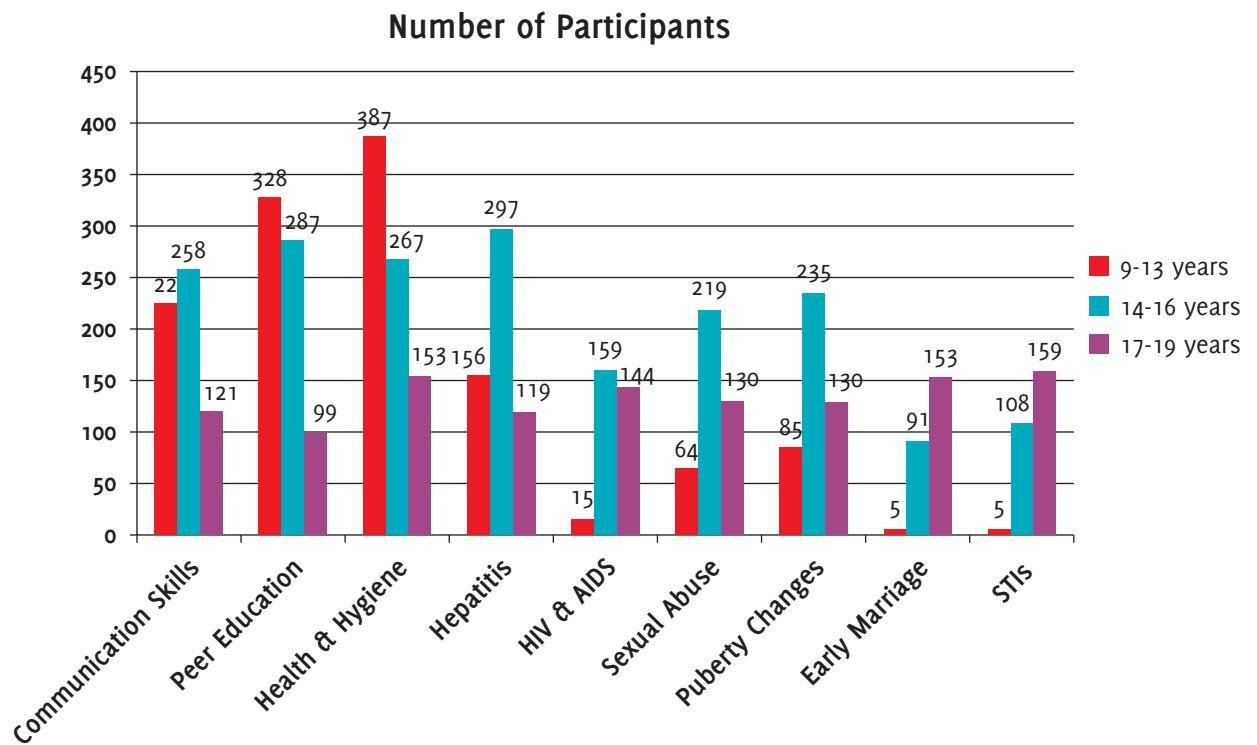
Participation of Adolescents in sports Activities



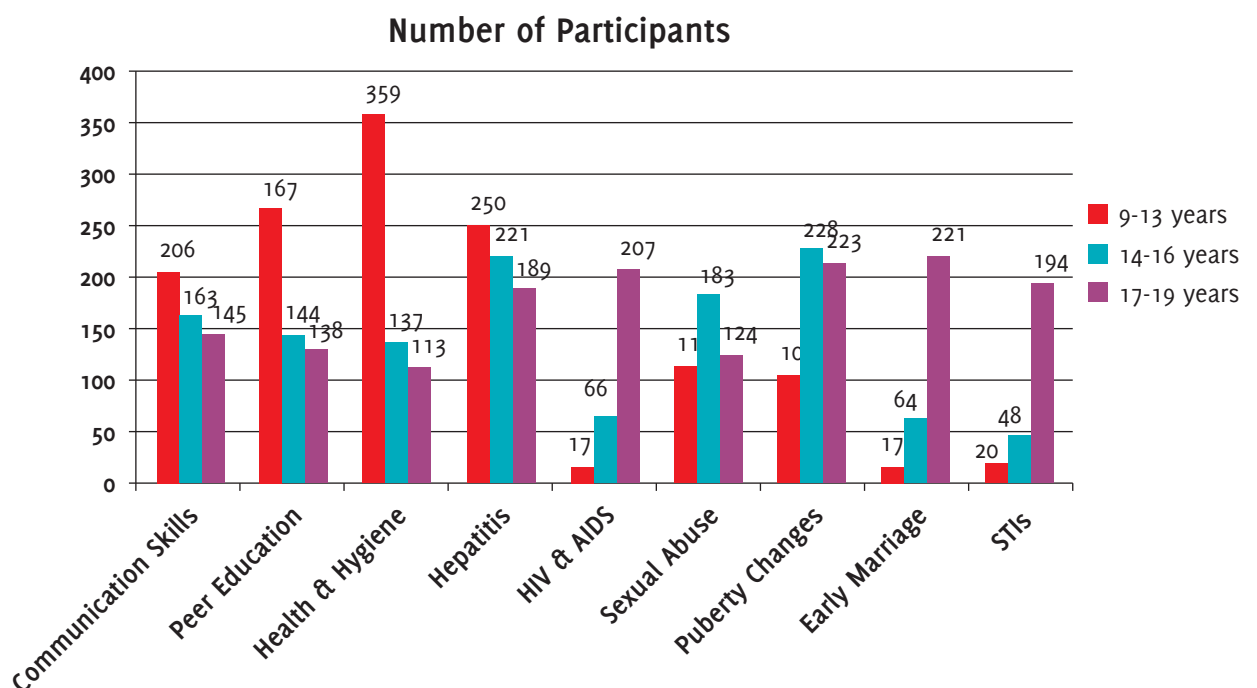
Participation of Adolescents in sports Activities

“Addressing Gender Based Violence and Promoting Women Rights”

GEP (Gender Equity Program) Cycle 4 (Punjab) Project Highlights

SACHET Pakistan has successfully implemented a project “Addressing Gender Based Violence & promoting Women Rights” under Gender Equity Program (GEP) of Aurat Foundation (AF), with the support of the American People through United States Agency for International Development (USAID) in 10 districts of Punjab (Rawalpindi, Chakwal, Attock, Jhelum, Sargodha Gujrat, Mandi Bahauddin, Khushab, Mianwali and Bhakar). The purpose of this campaign was to generate widespread societal demand and commitment for a socially just, democratic, caring and gender-responsive society particularly in these selected ten districts of Pakistan, where all citizens, women and men are recognized as equal, with the right to lead their lives with self-respect and dignity.

This campaign facilitated behavioral change: in particular to facilitate citizens’ active participation in the process of social change and governance at district and provincial level, enabling women to access information, resources and institutions, acquire control over their lives and improve attitudes and behavior towards women and their concerns.

Media (print & electronic) was actively engaged during the GEP campaign activities in all ten districts. A total number of 85 news articles published in 52 local and national news papers across ten districts.

PSA (Public service Announcements) on FM 97 across ten districts (total 60 spots of 27 sec) were relayed during the month of April 2012 in district Attock, Rawalpindi, Chakwal, Sargodha, Jhelum, Mianwali, Bhakar, Gujrat, Khushab and Mandi Bhauddin. 5 different messages were produced for PSA (Public Service Announcement) which were related to Gender Based Violence.

Four months campaign on gender based violence was concluded during the two days event in which 22 stalls were displayed by CSOs with information, education & communication materials used during the four months campaign along with a presentation by each CSO on their activities. SACHET has been awarded 1st prize for its efforts during the campaign cycle as well as during the closing ceremony.

Waseela-e-Sehet, Benazir Income Support Program

Project Highlights Faisalabad District

Benazir Income Support Program (BISP) of the GoP, is playing an increasingly central role in economic and social improvement of rural communities especially women from lower economic strata all over Pakistan since its inception in year 2008. It is aimed to enhance the financial capacities of poor and decreasing down their poverty. BISP, to uplift the poor people's living standards, has addressed issues of poverty by four initiatives i.e. Waseela-e-Haq for entrepreneurial development, Waseela-e-Rozgar for raising employment opportunities for government, Waseela-e-Taleem, a recent initiative added to promote child education via conditional cash transfer mechanism and Waseela-e-Sehet for ensuring provision of quality health facilities and life insurance.

SACHET Pakistan has successfully completed a pilot project under Waseela-e-Sehet of Benazir Income Support Program in Faisalabad District as an implementing non-profit partner to the program, supported by the GIZ. SACHET Pakistan following a competitive process for this challenging task, implemented BSC (Benazir Sehat Card) campaign by approaching 39,845 beneficiaries and distributed 33,643 Sehat cards to the selected beneficiaries in 6 tehsils of Faisalabad District.

The project ensured informing eligible beneficiary families about BSC through Public Information Campaign (PIC). This campaign sensitized and informed the target beneficiaries about the process of card disbursement, eligibility criteria, required documentation, features and benefits of the card.

The following table shows the summary of distribution of BSC in each tehsil. In this project, SACHET distributed 33,643 Benazir Sehat (BS) Cards out of a total of 39,845 cards and 6,202 cards were returned to respective tehsil office of BISP in Faisalabad District.

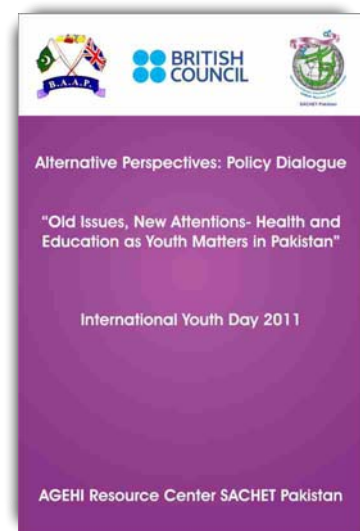
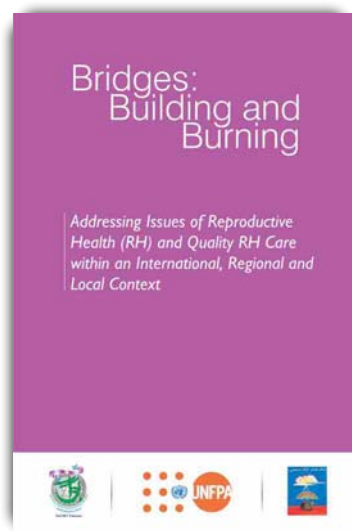

AGEHI founded in 2001 started holding a series of public policy advocacy dialogues on issues of social development under Alternative Perspectives in 2008. During the year, AGEHI Resource Centre, SACHET organized two policy dialogues under Alternative Perspectives, Policy Dialogue initiative.

1. "Old issues, new attentions-Health and Education as Youth matters in Pakistan" (August 12, 2011)
The policy Dialogue was organized in connection with International Youth Day 2011. The objective of this policy dialogue was to converge diverse voices and perspectives at one forum with the hope that the privileged data and information gained would be mainstreamed in media and consumed by policy makers in public, private and voluntary sectors of Pakistan-the sixth most populous country with the largest cohort on youth population in the history of the world. Representing a number of national and international organizations, participants came from diverse walks of life, such as

Planning Commission of Pakistan, UNFPA, National Institute of Health, Population Council, Allama Iqbal Open University, Care International, media and youth representative from local communities.

2. Bridges: Building and Burning. Addressing issues of Reproductive Health and quality RH care with an International, regional and local context (April 6, 2012).
In connection with the International Health Day 2012 activities, AGEHI Resource Centre, SACHET organized an interactive panel discussion for addressing issues of Reproductive Health (RH) and quality RH Care within International, Regional and local context on April 6, 2012. This event brought together the information on the current status of RH Issues of Pakistani women across the country with the objective to explore how they can be aligned to the ongoing development initiatives in different sectors. The session was chaired by Mr. Rabbi Royan (Country Representative UNFPA Pakistan) and moderated by Dr. Rakshinda Perveen (Co-Founder, Executive Director, SACHET).


