B. INTRODUCTION

Society for the Advancement of Community Health Education and Training (SACHET) Pakistan is a registered not for profit organization serving in Pakistan since its inception in 1999. SACHET has undertaken several advocacy initiatives with sustainable impacts, as well as service delivery initiatives with both international donor support as well as increasing philanthropic support rooted in the indigenous context.

SACHET has been working in social sector in Pakistan with the aim of assisting disadvantaged communities in realization and attainment of their human rights; enabling them to live with dignity and respect. SACHET works holistically to provide necessary support and facilitation in four key program areas: **health, education, livelihood and trainings** by provision of essential services, advocacy, communication, information dissemination, research and training of youth and adolescents and building up community partnerships. SACHET has vast and substantive experience in advocacy and service delivery of primary health care, reproductive health and rights, education with a clear focus on gender mainstreaming and gender equality, as well as consciousness on practical and strategic gender needs. SACHET also deals with sensitive issues of violence against women, girls and children, within the broader domain of reproductive health programming. SACHET has vast experience of working with community where rigorous community mobilization remained cross cutting area in its programs.

For last 23 years SACHET Pakistan has served in all regions and provinces of Pakistan, through advocacy related projects and it has been collaborating with diverse communities across Pakistan by implementing its research and need based programs through its advocacy and service delivery approach. SACHET has proven experience in evidence based research and problem diagnoses of underprivileged communities for coping up their problems through need-assessment based program development, which has produced sustainable results.

In 2012, SACHET was the only NGO selected through competitive process through GIZ of Germany to implement pilot project of BSC (Benazir Sehat Card) under Waseel-e-Sehat Program of BISP (Benazir Income Support Program) in Faisalabad district. It covered around 40,000 poor families from existing beneficiaries of BISP in six (6) tehsils of Faisalabad. The project ensured strong community mobilization informing eligible beneficiary families about BSC (Benazir Sehat Card) through Public Information Campaign (PIC). This campaign sensitized and informed the target beneficiaries about the process of card disbursement, eligibility criteria, required documentation, features and benefits of the card.

SACHET has worked under Gender Equity Program (GEP) supported by USAID which focused on advocacy and awareness of rural communities on gender equity, violence against girls and women and on pro-women legislation. This project which was targeting ten (10) districts of Punjab addressed variety of stakeholders including community gate keepers, religious leaders, youth, students, duty bearers, media, GBV (Gender based violence) survivors and victims and people from different professional groups. This was an awareness raising and behavioral change initiative which addressed different forms of violence including forced marriages, sexual abuse, and domestic violence.

Due to credible and meaningful contributions in social sector, SACHET was selected as partner organization with European Commission and UNFPA to implement RHIYA (Reproductive Health Initiative for youth in Asia) Project in District Chakwal. Around 250,000

young people and community members directly participated in different RHIYA related activities. RHIYA was a multi partner initiative that spans over seven south and south East Asian countries namely, Bangladesh, Cambodia, the Lao PDR, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka and Vietnam. In Pakistan, this project was implemented in five districts .SACHET implemented this projects in Pakistan with two other partner CSOs namely, Marie Stopes Society and PAVHNA. The main model of RHIYA project at district level is based on youth Friendly centers (YFCs), both for girls and boys .The YFCs offer services to empower youth by mobilization, educating and skill development. The youth take advantage of recreational activities provided at the centers, such as folk music, debate contests, reading and declamation contests etc. Both indoor and outdoor sports activities have been made available to the youth, with sports club activities.

During post-earthquake period, SACHET established Women Friendly Spaces in partnership with UNFPA including specific bathing spaces for women to address gender specific vulnerabilities and provided psycho-social support to women and adolescent girls through these centers in earthquake affected areas in two tehsils of Mansehra district. Around 21,455 women, girls and community members received direct services from Women Friendly Spaces and bathing spaces.

SACHET has proven experience in conducting consultations, workshops, seminars, youth summits, and women assemblies on district, provincial, national and international level. SACHET has conducted a series of policy dialogues in which it involved stakeholders from diverse groups for their opinions in the policy dialogue for producing the policy recommendation through consultative process.

Over the period of last 22 years SACHET has worked with multiple ranges of stakeholders irrespective of their religion and ethnicity, in all provinces of Pakistan and owns a noteworthy goodwill among its wider network across the country.

SACHET has strong administrative systems and has acceptable and updated standard operating procedures which are compatible with all kind of national and international organizations. SACHET is financially strengthened organization due to its sustainable financial planning. Its annual turnover ranges around 30 million PKR which it generates from its own investments. SACHET has dedicated human resource which is trained to serve in the all kind of circumstances. SACHET has strong and experienced program support staff besides expert program implementers.

SACHET-Pakistan has two institutional components, Program Development Unit (PDU) and Program Support Unit (PSU). Program Development unit runs the indigenous programs¹ of the SACHET an also contribute in international donor funded project as and when required. It has experienced professionals having significant expertise to run development programs. Program Support Unit of SAHET extends the administrative, financial management and HR support to ensure the smooth accomplishment of the projects. Support unit has expertise and linkages to work across all districts of Pakistan.

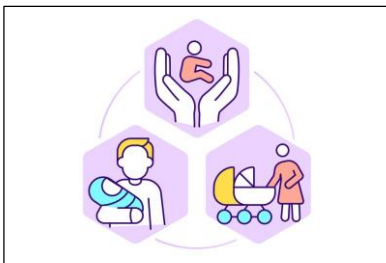
